About Habitat for Humanity:

Habitat for Humanity Roaring Fork is a nonprofit organization that builds affordable housing and operates ReStore outlets serving communities from Aspen to Parachute. Habitat has built some of the first LEED Platinum homes on the Western Slope, and is close to diverting more than 1,000,000 pounds of building materials, furniture and household items from local landfills.

Project Scope*:

This request will support the inclusion of LED lighting and a 50 kW solar array at Habitat’s new flagship ReStore on Highway 82 between Carbondale and Glenwood Springs.

Total Project Cost: \$233,328

Amount Requested: \$115,000

CORE grant amount: \$75,000

Annual Energy Savings*:

146,000 kWh/ year

Carbon Savings*:

111 tons per year or 2,220 tons over the project lifetime, equivalent to taking 467 cars off the road or taking 203 homes off the grid.
